Subject: **Request that You Refund 20,000 FCFA Paid to You as “deposit for stamp duty”**

Dear Ms. Apongwa Nji Elizabeth,

We are writing to remind you of letter (Reference No. PLF/SL/PCFIK/01/08 of 01/10/08 from PENS Law Firm, Kumba), that was duly delivered to you, requesting you, in line with Section 8 of Law No: 2006/15 of 29/12/2006, to refund the 20,000 FCFA (Twenty thousand francs CFA) that was paid to you as “deposit for stamp duty” in the filing of Suit No: CFIK/11/2008 between Mbwoye Daniel Mbong and the National Water Corporation (SNEC) now Camerounais Des Eaux (CDE). As you know, the Court of First Instance Kumba on 01/07/08 declared itself incompetent to deal with the matter and threw it out.

A reminding letter (Reference No: PLK/SL/PCFIK/01/08 of 01/02/09) was also delivered to you in your office. It is 7 (seven) months now since you received the reminder and almost a year since you have been with the initial request and, by all accounts, nothing has been heard from you.

This is another reminder and appeal that you promptly respond to the requests made, in the public interest, as required by law.
